District 8 C.F. & Service Rep Steve Lowe sent out an e-mail last week with all the awards that are available.

2.7 HAL & ELSPETH ROGERS NATIONAL SERVICE AWARD

Objective:

- To encourage clubs to participate in Service work within their community.
- To recognize the club that has contributed the most to the fundamental objective of the Association i.e. service work.

Management:

1. The service project must have been completed within the 12 month period prior to the date of the conference at which it was originally presented (Zone or District).
2. The same service project may not be entered in two successive years unless it has been materially advanced and/or compared to the involvement of any other parties on the submitted project.
3. Where multiple clubs collaborate on and/or jointly participate in a service project, or where one club materially contributes to the service project of the other during the currency of that project, and only one club chooses to submit the project for award consideration, the other club cannot submit the same project in the following year unless it complies with the previous requirement.
4. A national winner will not be allowed to enter the same project for three years after winning the award.
5. The entry so chosen shall be forwarded in **triplicate**, together with a disk containing at least 10 photographs per entry, by the appropriate district officer to National Headquarters prior to June 30th.
6. The disk forwarded pursuant to paragraph 5 hereof may be used by National Headquarters for presentation of the district winners at National Convention and may also be used in national publications and on the national website.
7. The form of submission for each entry at the national level shall be written narrative form of approximately 2,000 words. No other form of presentation will be permitted.

Judges

- The national awards committee will appoint a panel of three judges.

Reward:

- The winner will receive a keeper plaque and club banner crest.
- The winners name will also be added to the National Plaque.
- The winner and runner up will be announced at National Convention

VISION 2020 GREEN PROJECT AWARD

3.1 VISION 2020 GREEN PROJECT AWARD

Objective

- To encourage clubs to participate in projects within their community that will promote positive environmental change, recycling, and/or waste reduction.

Eligibility

- Clubs must be in good standing

Management

1. The project must have been completed with the 12 month period prior to the date of the conference at which it was originally presented.
2. The same project may not be entered in two successive years
3. A national winner will not be allowed to enter the same project for three years after winning the award
4. Entries will be forwarded in electronic form, with at least 10 pictures to Jessica Wulff at National Headquarters by June 30th. As this is a Green Award paper submissions will not be accepted.
5. The form of submission for each entry at the National level shall be a written narrative of approximately 2,000 words.
6. Written submission should include: How the project impacted the environment, did the club gain community recognition for positive environmental change.

Bill Skelly Awards

Submission Deadline: Friday June 11, 2010

The Bill Skelly Awards, presented by the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation (CCFF), is an annual program that recognizes outstanding Kin Canada events that raise funds and awareness for the CCFF.

The awards program is open to all Kinsmen, Kinette, and Kin clubs from across Canada. Only one (1) event (not a series of events) will be considered per nomination. A Bill Skelly Award will be presented to the winning club in each Kin District. In order to qualify for the 2009-10 Bill Skelly Awards, the event must:

- Take place between June 1, 2009 and May 31, 2010;
- Raise funds for the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation (not for an individual or family); and
- Raise public awareness of the cystic fibrosis cause.

A judging committee, with members from both Kin Canada and the CCFF, will evaluate the nomination entries. Award winners will be announced at the 2010 Kin Canada National Convention in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Winning clubs will receive a Bill Skelly Awards certificate, a District Bill Skelly Awards banner, and will be featured in the 2010 Fall/Winter edition of the *Kin-CCFF Chronicle* newsletter. The winning clubs will also be featured in local news releases written and distributed by the CCFF.

Your nomination submission should include the following:

1. **A completed Bill Skelly Awards Nomination Form** (see below)
2. **Detailed description of the event, including:**
 - **Planning and Organization**
 - Concept development (or history of the event)
 - Resources used
 - Participation of club members (and other volunteers)
 - **Publicity and Promotion**
 - Methods used to promote and advertise the event, and the cystic fibrosis cause
 - **Budget**
 - Amount of money raised (net dollars)
3. **Photos and newspaper clippings** (if applicable)

If anyone would like help or more info on these or other awards they can be found on the National website and the District website. Also I am available to help out anyone who may be interested in any of these or any other awards.
